From Marietta, Sandy Springs, North Fulton County,
Gwinnett County, and South Atlanta:
Get on the Perimeter Highway, I-285
Exit at Riverside Drive, exit 24. (This exit is between Roswell Road/Sandy Springs and I-75.)
Go south on Riverside Drive, about one-half mile, to a stop sign, where Riverside dead-ends into Mt. Vernon Drive. Turn right onto Mt. Vernon, and stay in the right-hand lane. The church is about one-tenth mile ahead on the right-hand

From Atlanta and Buckhead:

side of the road.

Beginning at the intersection of West Paces Ferry Road and Northside Drive, go north on Northside Drive about three miles.

Stay on Northside Drive; (it bears to the right), another one and a half miles

Bear to the right to get onto Mt. Vernon Hwy.

Go about 1.1 miles and you will see the church on your left.
